# Introduction

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Every machine, control panel, and piece of equipment leaving your facility carries your brand's reputation. The labels attached to them aren't just stickers - they do serious heavy lifting:

- **Defining your brand identity** with crisp, durable logos and graphics.
- **Protecting user safety** with high-visibility hazard and instruction decals.
- **Ensuring long-term compliance** with indestructible rating plates and serial tags.

For many Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs), sourcing these components is a fragmented nightmare. You order vinyl decals from Vendor A, graphic overlays from Vendor B, and metal serial plates from Vendor C. Or worse, you place dozens of individual purchase orders with single vendor for every single label on a single machine.

Maximum efficiency happens when labeling aligns directly with your product families and value streams. Matching kits to your specific operational steps eliminates workstation confusion and prevents simple label stock outs from delaying major shipments.

While sourcing parts piecemeal might feel standard, it quietly injects friction, administrative bloat, and unexpected costs into your supply chain.

# The Problem:

## Where the Hidden Costs Live

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When you manage labeling components individually, you create hidden bottlenecks across every stage of manufacturing.



### Procurement & Administrative Overhead:

Managing 10 to 20 individual SKUs for a single finished product means 10 to 20 line items, multiple purchase orders, constant stock checks, and invoice juggling. Your procurement team ends up managing label logistics instead of focusing on high-value strategic sourcing.

### Receiving & Inventory Headaches:

Every incoming label, metal plate, and decal sheet requires separate receiving, inspection, tagging, and bin space. Tracking dozens of loose components creates inventory chaos, increases holding costs, and heightens the risk of losing small parts in the warehouse.

### Assembly Line Scavenger Hunts:

This is where piecemeal sourcing hurts the most. When a machine reaches the labeling stage, line workers waste precious minutes gathering parts from multiple bins across the floor.

**The Line-Down Danger:** *If even **one** critical safety label or rating plate is missing or out of stock, the entire machine sits idle. You can't ship incomplete equipment.*

### Mismatched Branding & Compliance Exposure:

Sourcing across different vendors - or even different material runs - often leads to mismatched brand colors, inconsistent finishes, and varied adhesive lifespans. Worse yet, when workers manually gather loose labels, human error sneaks in: a warning label gets skipped, or the wrong decal gets applied.

**The answer to these challenges is remarkably simple: Label Kits.**

# The Solution: Consolidating with Label Kits

## What is a Labeling Kit?

A Label Kit consolidates every label, overlay, decal, and metal plate required for a specific machine into one prepackaged, single-SKU bundle.

Instead of issuing dozens of purchase orders, you order one part number. Your assembly team receives one package containing every exact component needed to complete one unit or one operational step in your production value stream.

## Tailored to how You Build: Flexible Kitting Formats

No two assembly lines are identical. That's why custom kits are engineered around your specific production flow and environmental requirements.



### Single Sheet Kits (Sequential Peel & Stick)

All vinyl decals, graphic overlays, and instruction labels for a single product are layout-matched and kiss-cut onto a single backer sheet. Excess material is peeled off the backer sheet making easier to remove the label.

**How it works:** Line workers peel and apply each label in a clear, predetermined sequence.

**The Benefit:** Less inventory searching & staging. Built-in mistake-proofing (Poka-Yoke). If a label remains on the sheet at the end of the station, the operator immediately knows a step was missed.

### Bundled Loose Label Sets

For complex products with multi-stage assembly sequences across different stations, precut labels and plates are shrink wrapped or grouped into custom-labeled bags or kitted trays.

**How it works:** Everything required for a specific sub-assembly or workstation arrives presorted in a dedicated container.

**The Benefit:** Eliminates component hunting while keeping station-specific parts neatly organized.



## Tailored to how You Build: Flexible Kitting Formats (Continued)



### Mixed Substrate Engineering

Industrial equipment requires different materials for different surfaces. A single NPT kit seamlessly blends diverse substrates into one shipment:

- **Vinyl & Film Decals:** Flexible, vibrant graphics for branding and outer enclosures.
- **Polyester & Polycarbonate Overlays:** Rugged, scratch resistant overlays for control panels, keypads, and touchscreens.
- **Metalphoto® & Stainless Steel Plates:** Ultra-durable, chemical-resistant plates for serial numbers, rating data, and harsh-environment asset tags.
- **Laminated & Protective Labels:** UV, chemical, and abrasion-resistant labels engineered for heavy outdoor exposure.

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## Strategic Kitting Methods for OEM Manufacturing

Organizing your kits around your exact assembly line workflow is key to maximizing efficiency. Depending on how your factory operates, we engineer three primary kitting strategies:

- **Model-Specific Kits (The “One-to-One” Approach):** The most popular and foolproof method. Every graphic overlay, serial plate, warning decal, and logo required for a specific machine model is kiss-cut onto one master sheet or packaged together. If you’re building 50 machines today, your team pulls exactly 50 kits to the floor.
- **Assembly Stage Kits:** Designed for highly complex or large-scale machinery. Labels are broken down by production stage (e.g., Phase 1: Chassis Kit, Phase 2: Control Panel Overlay Kit, Phase 3: QA Safety Kit). This prevents unused labels from sitting on workbenches and getting damaged during early manufacturing phases.
- **Contingency & Buffer Kits (The “Zero Downtime Recovery):** A separate mini-kit that sits at the specific assembly station containing extra high-risk labels. If an operator misaligns a logo, they grab a spare from the workstation buffer instead of breaking open a brand-new master kit.
- **Service & Refurbishment Kits:** Built specifically for field service technicians and authorized dealer networks. These kits package replacement warning decals, updated branding plates, and instructional overlays so older equipment can be quickly brought up to current safety and branding standards during a repair or rebuild.
